Commodore's Report

Thank you for being patient and most of all, very supportive. We have a large group of captains with different ideas but at the end we seem to always put our differences

to the side and join forces. We all have positive intentions to make our Club the best it can be for our families.

I also appreciate all the affirmations, but I can't take the credit. Our employees have worked their rear ends off to make our Club run smoothly. Our goal was to pick up and go like nothing happened and they certainly achieved that! Our Fleet Captain Amanda Romano had our sailing school open the same day as the fire. Carl and his group had the dining room brought downstairs in working order. Chris Davidson was already making progress to set up our downstairs bar for the summer. Thank goodness our bar faucets were already installed. Bobby and his gang set up our outside kitchen in the scorching heat. Ms. Cyndi and Carl did an excellent job making sure the pool stayed clear until Bruce Smalls and Kenny Watson could get our temporary poles up and running. This was all done in a matter of a few days of the incident. This wasn't for their own gratification. This was all for the love of our Club!

Our Club is in the second phase of its rehabilitation. The paperwork has been filed to receive an advance payment from our insurance company. And to those who have questioned why we didn't put our Club back together immediately with the funds we already have in the bank ... we absolutely could have done that but in order to receive the maximum amount from our insurance company, we needed the insurance adjuster and our hired adjuster to do a thorough exam of the Club, as well as, gathering ALL the supporting documents of what exactly was lost to get a full and complete refund. Having done this personally for my business during Katrina has helped me to understand the process, and also for the Club after this fire, we are right on target. Carl and his crew will be pulling down the ceiling tiles and insulation in the next few days. This will be done in preparation for the cleaning crew to remove any remaining smoke residues and for a crew of electricians to rewire our Club. Look for a lot of garbage to be removed in the following week, with an additional dumpster on the property.

There was talk of having a special called membership meeting to vote on some proposed changes to our bylaws. While I do think this is very important, I think rebuilding our Club is more important. However, I would like to have a "Town Hall" style meeting. Communication is very critical in running a business, and a lack of it a detriment, and I would like to hear from you all. I have been warned that an open forum could be harsh. I disagree! It's important for the future of our Club to be on the same page and to understand everyone's thoughts. I also have thick skin and can take constructive criticism. Please join me Monday, August 7th at 6:30 PM. There will be no voting; just a question and answer forum.



I am a firm believer that everything happens for a reason! When a difficult circumstance happens, stop and absorb it. Think of all the good that can come out of this difficult time. In our circumstance, there were a couple of great things that worked in our favor. New commercial equipment that was initially planned prior to the fire will now be paid for by our insurance. Also, togetherness as one! As far as I can remember our Club has always been segregated by age. Our elders seem to congregate upstairs while our young families mostly stay outside with their children by the pool. Our difficult situation has changed the dynamics of our Club and it hasn't been as difficult as we thought it could be! It makes my heart happy! Absorb the difficult times because someone out there has it worse off. In the end it will make us more resilient and stronger!
