As many of y'all have noticed, a demolition crew has removed our burnt decking, electric, HVAC and ceiling. At the end of the week, we will have a commercial electrical crew install a temporary panel that they have built. It will restore enough electricity for workers to reconstruct the inside of our building. This is where the magic will happen! We have already started taking bids to finish out the electrical work, install our air conditioning system, and reconstruct our ceiling. I am proud to announce that the insurance company will be releasing more money for a newer and better AC, electrical panel and kitchen vent. And with the help of our attorneys, we are going to try to squeeze out a little extra money for some structural changes. I am not promising, but we may have

enough to build a bigger bar. It is the last priority on our list, but I'm trying my damnedest to make it happen. With all of this said, I am still holding strong with my timeline! I've been told by many people it will not happen, but I think with a lot of persistence and dedication to this project we can make it. I'm still shooting for November.
