At OSYC, the month of November saw a flurry of activity administratively, physically and operationally. Administratively, I am excited and proud to announce that we hired Gina Welch as our new administrative assistant. Gina has a wealth of experience in customer/member relations and bookkeeping/office skills. In the brief time that she has been here, she has already proven herself as an invaluable addition to our staff. Gina will handle routine member issues and general administrative functions. Please welcome Gina into to our OSYC family!

Physically, as quite a few of you have seen, the upstairs has undergone a massive and quite visible transformation. For example, the brand new HVAC units have been delivered, the wall divider has been removed, the bar has been rebuilt, and the kitchen is being renovated.

Operationally, our new software system, Clubessential, has shifted from planning to the pre-implementation stage. Our wonderful, dedicated staff also have been engaged in numerous training calls as well as practicing with the new software. The system is about 75% complete and implemented. The only section that is still undergoing revisions is the private, members-only website. This module is a new feature that will allow members to see the club calendar and events, access monthly statements, and manage your method of paying your monthly bill.

Excluding the private website, we are scheduled to have the system "go live" on December 1st. The members-only website should be live in mid-late December. We will keep you apprised and updated as we progress in that process.

This holiday season at OSYC is exciting for additional reasons. In addition to the always fun gift-giving and family gatherings, we are inching closer and closer to reopening. The light at the end of the tunnel is becoming bigger and brighter each day!
